Call for Adjunct Lecturers

What you'll do:

As an Adjunct Lecturer, you will be given a module descriptor, learning outcomes, and module slide sets and will be responsible for delivering the module(s) to which you are assigned over a 24-week period. This includes the following mandatory activities:

- Teach your module over a 24-week period for 2 hours per week during term time (typical UK university holidays are observed)
- Create two coursework assessments and two exams per module and provide grading for all assessments*
- Administer module satisfaction surveys to students
- Attend a one-day 'team meeting' at the start of term to:
 - o induct you to our processes and procedures

- work with our Programme Leads, Teaching Leads and External Moderators (we call them Link Tutors) on designing appropriate assessments
- take some time to prepare your teaching sessions with our support
- ask any questions to help with preparation
- Attend team meetings with other Adjunct Lecturers and Programme Lead
- Be available via email for student and administrative queries

You have the academic freedom to design the course as you see fit within the remit of: the module descriptor, learning outcomes, and the support of the Pathway Programme Lead and Link Tutors. We have high standards, and we expect a lot of Adjunct Lecturers, yet we offer outstanding long-term career opportunities for the right applicant, both within Lancaster University Leipzig as we continue to grow, and within Europe and beyond as part of the Navitas Group.

You will receive a payment per module that you teach, generally payable in equal instalments at three points throughout the year: in December, in April, and in July (after teaching, marking, and moderation is complete). - A teaching qualification (e.g. PGCE, PGCHE, PGCAP, or equivalent) (D)
- Postgraduate degree and/or PhD in your subject area (D)

Application Process:

Please send your cover letter, curriculum vitae, and two contacts (including positions) for recommendation letters in one PDF file, indicating your name, to recruitment@lancasterleipzig.de. If your application is seen as a suitable fit, the following process will be observed:

1. You will be invited to attend a short online meeting to get to know each other, usually with the Programme Lead and the Senior Manager of Academic & Student Services, and be asked to share a snippet of your teaching style through a short section of a lecture (around 10-15 minutes). This can be a recording or delivered live.

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2. You will be invited to interview where we will explore your teaching philosophy and a 'typical' teaching and assessment exercise.
